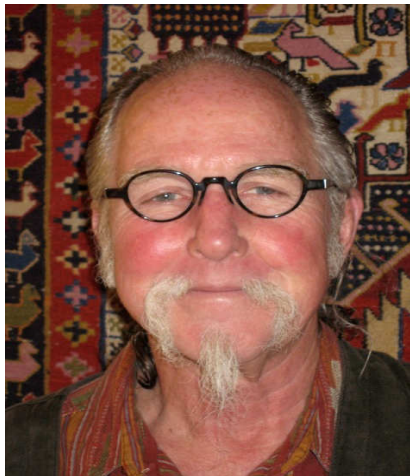

Bill Secrest is a faculty member and a Historian of Religions . He has been asked by the Diversity Club on campus to give this important lecture on Christianity and Islam. Bill is neither a professed Muslim or Christian, but rather a historian who is sympathetic to both of these religious traditions. He will be providing his own personal reflections after having studied and taught about these two faiths during the past 40 years. Bill has taken two sabbaticals that have taken him across the world to sacred places where he investigated interfaith relations.

This talk will feature a brief overview of the three Abrahmic faith traditions: Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. He will provide a perspective that features harmony and dialog between faiths. There are always challenges but also opportunities for building multi-faith appreciation in Southeast Michigan. These will be explored. A forum will be available for those attending to ask questions.

This free lecture, open to the public, will be of special interest to everybody within the college community, including faculty, staff, and administrators.
