- The pathway allows multiple associate degree options with the flexibility to customize your degree path. The minimum eligibility to participate in the Wayne State Transfer Pathways is a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above, Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), and an associate degree (earned or Reverse Transfer). - All college-level (non-developmental), non-duplicated courses with a 2.0 (C) grade point average (GPA) or above will be considered for transfer credit. Earned credit will transfer as 1) direct course

equivalency, 2) major/department credit, or 3) elective credit. Credits not earned at the community college will need to be taken at WSU.

- The pathway was signed October 10, 2025.
- These pathways do not replace the importance of academic advising. The pathway provides a general roadmap to degree completion.

Transfer Pathway Agreement

This Pathway shall become effective upon execution by both Parties and shall remain in effect until one Party terminates in accordance with the Institutional Articulation Agreements for Transfer Pathways Agreement. The Pathway will be reviewed annually by both Parties for curriculum and other required updates. This Pathway shall abide by all language of the Institutional Articulation Agreement for Transfer Pathways between Henry Ford College and Wayne State University.
